Dr. Benjalug Namfa

Dr. Benjalug Namfa, a consultant to the Office of the Basic Education Commission (OBEC), Ministry of Education, has a broad and profound understanding of education policy and practice. She has served Thailand in various positions, both at the high policy making and implementation practitioner levels. While she was an Inspector General, advising the Minister, her scope of work was widened. She overlooked three main types of education, including formal, non-formal, and informal, and at all levels, from early childhood education to higher education and continuing education for lifelong learning, bringing them up to quality standards. She employed her expertise in teacher development and learning processes. Throughout her career, it has been a great honor to serve many educational programs of the Royal Development Projects.

She is a pioneer in education reform introducing the "student-centered learning" approach as outlined in the National Education Act 1999 and the Basic Education Curriculum of Thailand, overseeing its implementation in classrooms throughout country. While she was the Deputy Secretary-General of OBEC, she faced the challenge of implementing the national Literacy, Numeracy, and Reasoning Ability Program. This program involved literacy scanning methods, tools and materials, online follow up and monitoring, reporting, and evaluation. The program has raised public awareness of the importance of literacy and promoted reading nationwide. Meanwhile, Dr. Benjalug has also contributed to the design of 15-year free education policy since 2009, which is based on the principles of a rights-based education.

She envisages Thai society in 2015 as being a part of the ASEAN Community in the 21st century and has translated this vision into school practice. The programs have given rise to several international cooperation initiatives including the establishment of the ASEAN Studies Center in every province, ASEAN language courses, and the ASEAN Youth Leadership Camp. She also participates in developing the ASEAN Curriculum Source Book with other ASEAN countries, which is implemented by integrating the national curriculum of each of the countries.

Dr. Benjalug is also a country representative for various conferences organized by international educational organizations, including UNESCO and UNICEF, SEAMEO, ASCD, and the World Bank. She works as a consultant to and adviser on education development policy and as a lecturer for both the public and private sectors in Thailand and abroad.

Dr. Benjalug holds a doctorate degree in Curriculum, Teaching & Educational Policy and a master's degree in Elementary Education from Michigan State University, USA.
